BEFORE KIDS CAN LEARN TO READ, THEY LEARN THAT LETTERS HAVE NAMES AND REPRESENT SOUNDS... THAT'S LETTER KNOWLEDGE!

Letter knowledge helps children discover the code of reading and writing words. If children start school with some letter knowledge, they will have a greater likelihood of mastering phonics and becoming fluent readers and writers! Also note, children with strong letter knowledge are able to identify letters in any order.

Playing with shapes is a great way to introduce
 letter knowledge to babies and toddlers. For example, talk about how a big square and a little square are both squares. This prepares your child to understand lowercase and uppercase letters.

1) Sing
2) Talk
3) Read
4) Write
5) Play


## Fun Ways to Build Letter Knowledge

- Sing "The Alphabet Song" to the tune of other familiar songs, like "Old MacDonald Had a Farm" or "Mary Had a Little Lamb."
- Read alphabet books, but don't worry about reading the pages in order.
- Point to letters and numbers in books, and look for shapes inside letters.
- Go on a letter hunt: Can you find items around the house that have a letter on them? Or, choose a letter and find all the items around your house that start with that letter!
