### 14 RADNOR-AREA NONPROFITS TO PARTICIPATE IN UPCOMING DELAWARE COUNTY-SPECIFIC GIVING INITIATIVE *Third Annual “Delco Gives” Runs May 6-7, 2026*

**Delaware County, PA (April 28, 2026)** – Fourteen Radnor-area nonprofits have combined forces to participate in an upcoming local philanthropy opportunity: the 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Delco Gives, a community initiative to increase collective philanthropy through online giving in county-wide support of hundreds of local nonprofits serving Delaware County.

Hosted by [The Foundation for Delaware County](https://www.foundationforde.com/), Delco Gives encourages the community to explore and donate to a diverse range of nonprofits serving Delaware County through the [delcogives.org](https://delcogives.org) online platform. The initiative runs from Wednesday, May 6 – Thursday, May 7, 2026. Last year, this initiative raised \$2.3 million.

In 2025, the median donation was just **\$30**, proving that every gift counts. All proceeds go directly to participating nonprofits. Each donation will also be eligible for bonus funding from the Foundation and generous sponsors, helping every contribution go further. Bonus funds are awarded based on the **number of donors** supporting an organization — not the size of the donation — ensuring that broad community participation drives impact.

Funds raised through donations and community events not only sustain our nonprofit's program and services but also enable special initiatives that impact local families, from emergency needs grants to adaptive bike giveaways for children living with disabilities.

The Radnor Educational Foundation brings innovation to public school classrooms, supporting more than 3,600 Radnor students in five schools. Since its inception in 1994, the Foundation has awarded more than \$1.5 million in grants to the Radnor Township School District students and teachers. Grants have covered a diverse number of programs in numerous categories, including: STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) Programs, Curriculum Enhancement, Cultural Arts, Technology, Professional Development, and Community Engagement.

Grants from the Foundation are awarded three times per academic year, including a fall, winter, and spring grant season. Grant applications are received from students, faculty, administrators, and parents within Radnor Township School District. The Foundation is an independent, charitable 501(c)(3) organization registered in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and is funded solely through donations from individuals and corporations, partner tax credits via the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program, and annual fundraising events.

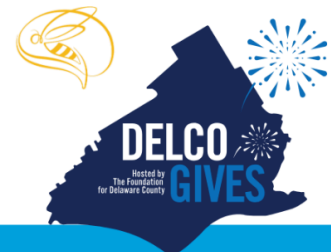
